

TLE and TVE Technolympics

I. Participants

1. The National TLE and STVE Technolympics,, which will showcase the skills acquired by the students in the various areas of specialization in all components of the Technology and Livelihood Education (TLE) and Strengthened Technical - Vocational Education (STVE) is open to all high school students enrolled in the public General and Technical Vocational and private high schools all over the Philippines.

2. Official Delegation

The members of the regional delegation to the National TLE and STVE Technolympics are as follows:

- 2.1. Regional Director – Head of the Delegation

- 2.3. Official Coaches
- 2.4. Division Supervisors
- 2.5. Regional Supervisor In charge of TLE and STVE

Official delegates are expected to send Pre-registration at least two weeks before the scheduled National TLE and STVE Technolympics with the following details:

- Total number of Male and Female student participant with corresponding sizes (for T-shirt)
- Total number of Male and Female (Teacher/Supervisor) Delegates with corresponding sizes (for T-shirt)
- The regional directors, Schools Division Superintendent, Supervisors, Principals and others who will join the official delegation in Iloilo City shall pay a registration fee in the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P2,500.00) to be charged to the region/division/school funds or other sources of funds to cover board and lodging. Payment should be made in cash. Check-in shall be on April 9 with dinner as the first meal and check-out shall be on April 12, 2012 with p.m. snack as the last meal.

II. Management

1. The National TLE /STVE Technolympics will be managed by an Executive Committee composed of the officials from the Bureau of Secondary Education. A Technical Working Group composed of local counterparts from the host region and selected BSE TLE Specialists will spearhead the conduct of the said activity.
2. The conduct of Technolympics in the division and regional levels shall be managed by the Division and Regional Supervisors and officials.

II. Contest Guidelines

1. Selection and Elimination of participants

1.1 Lower levels

- 1.1.1 The Division Officials will conduct their own selection during the Technolympics in their respective areas.
- 1.1.2 The Regional Officials likewise will hold the same activity in their level to select representatives to the National Festival of Talents (TLE/TVE Technolympics)

1.2 National Level

- 1.2.1 The national winners shall be declared among the competing participants.

5. Technolympics Mechanics:

1. Eligibility

- 1.1 The National Technolympics shall be participated in by bona fide students enrolled in the Public, General, and Technical Vocational, and Private high schools during the School Year 2011 – 2012, duly certified by the school heads.
- 1.2 Likewise, the school principal shall certify that the participants are enrolled in the field of specialization where they are competing and participating.
- 1.3 Contest trainers must submit the following:
 - 1.3.1 Certificate of appointment
 - 1.3.2 Certification from the principal of his designation as the trainer

2. Contest

- 2.1 A region shall have only one contestant per event.
- 2.2 A participant may only compete in one event
- 2.3 There shall be twenty (12) individual events and a group contest.

2.3.1 Exhibits

- 2.3.1.1 All the participating regions are required to display the best practices of TLE and STVE students as well as products produced from entrepreneurial activities in the school which must be supported by verifiable

documents. They shall be displayed in a common exhibit booth to be provided by the host school.

2.3.1.2 All the items in the exhibits must be offered for sale,

2.3.1.3 All products/service offered/displayed in the exhibits are produced/rendered by the TLE and STVE students as attested by the School heads.

2.4 Mechanics of Judging

2.4.1 The products and performances of the contestants in all the events shall be judged by three (3) members of the Board of Judges composed of two (2) experts from the field and one (1) BSE Specialist.

2.4.2 Judges will use the prepared Scoring Rubrics for both products and performances. Points given to each of the contestants shall be added by each of the members of the Jury. The total scores of each contestants shall be ranked with the highest total number of points as rank one (1).

2.4.3 The Chairman shall review the computation and ranking made by the judges. The contestant with the highest total number of points shall be declared champion.

2.4.4 The final results shall be reviewed by the members of the Board of Judges before affixing their signatures in the tabulation sheet.

2.4.5 In case of a tie, triple tie or a quadruple tie, the contestant who finished first will be declared champion. If the tie is still not resolved, toss coin will be applied.

2.4.6 The decision of the Board of judges is final.

6. Prizes and Awards

- a. The contestants and the coaches shall be awarded Certificates of Recognition and Participation.
- b. Trophies/ Medals and a Certificate of Merit will be awarded to the first three top placers.
- c. For purposes of determining the general championship, the rank system shall be followed.
